How is it developed?

In cooperation with parents, staff, and community members, *Rocky Plains Elementary School* (R.P.E.S.) has established this Parent & Family Engagement Policy. Who is it for?

At *Rocky Plains Elementary School*, all students are eligible to participate in the Title I, Part A Program. *Rocky Plains Elementary School* will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents with disabilities, parents of migratory students, and parents with limited English.

Where is it available?

The Parent & Family Engagement Policy is distributed to all students at the beginning of each school year in our Title I Information Packet. The policy is also accessible in the office, on our school's website, and provided per parent request. Parents and families are invited to give feedback throughout the school year through Parent & Family Engagement meetings, on our annual surveys, and at the end of the year Parent & Family Feedback & Revision Meeting.

To accomplish the mission of Newton County Schools, four goals have been set for Rocky Plains Elementary School.

- $\Rightarrow~$ Increase reading by 3% for students in grades ~ K– 5 as measured by FastBridge.
- ⇒ Increase the percent of students in grades 3-5 scoring at Proficient or Distinguished Learner in ELA by 3% as measured by GMAS.
- $\Rightarrow~$ Increase math by 3% for students in grades K-5 as measured by FastBridge.
- ⇒ Increase the percent of students in grade 3-5 scoring at Developing, Proficient, or Distinguished Learner in Math by 3% as measured by GMAS.

School-Parent & Family Compact
